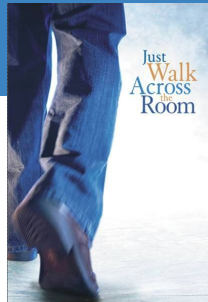

- **What is *Just Walk Across the Room*?**

It is a four-week Church Campaign intended to teach simple ways of pointing people to faith. It originated from a series of five talks delivered by Bill Hybels, the founding senior pastor of Willow Creek Community Church.

- **When will it take place?**

From January 24 to February 14. We will begin with prayer and fasting on January 23-24 and conclude with a Pancake Dinner celebration on Fat Tuesday, February 16.

- **What is involved?**

Each sermon and worship service for the four Sundays will deal with pointing people to faith as well as reading the book, *Just Walk Across the Room*. In addition, we are encouraging existing and new small groups to study the book together, or one can do it as an independent study.

- **Why four weeks?**

You've heard the old saying about it taking 28 days to form a new habit. Well, we just happen to believe that it's true. One month: it's long enough to cultivate a new perspective but short enough to keep you engaged throughout the entire experience.

- **I hear it's about evangelism. Will I be knocking on doors?**

Not at all. Evangelism, simply put, is "pointing people to faith." Jesus commissioned each of us to spread the Good News, but most of us don't know how or where to begin. It can take many forms, and you will be able to choose what is most comfortable for you.

- **What is a Divine Appointment?**

It's watching for and recognizing opportunities, and then engaging with others in winsome and meaningful conversation about our faith in Christ, or in some way engaging in meaningful activity to demonstrate our faith in Christ.

- **Something new?**

We are asking the congregation to participate in a period of prayer and fasting before the launch date of January 24th. Christians through the ages have observed times and seasons with spiritual disciplines for specific acts of discipleship. Our Book of Order states, "Christians observe special times and seasons for the disciplines of fasting, keeping vigil, and other forms of enacted prayer. It is also appropriate to observe these disciplines at any time, especially in preparation for specific acts of discipleship..." W-5.5003

- **I hear I'm supposed to write "my faith story." What's that?**

As part of JWAR, each of us will try to write a short, 45-second story, a "Before & After Story" of a time when God's reality in our life resulted in a significant change in us. Writing our stories will help prepare us to share our faith with others.

For some, this may recount a dramatic moment when we came to faith in Christ. For others, who cannot pinpoint when they came to faith - whose faith has grown as a slow discernment process since childhood, it might be a significant "Aha" moment, an experience when God's presence was demonstrated in a powerful way, or maybe even something that took time for you to realize the Holy Spirit was at work. Stories will include what we were like before the experience, and how we were different afterwards... what we learned about God's grace and love and how that changed us.
