FROM THE PASTORS



We face the challenges of a new year with many questions and at times apprehensions about the future. Yet we know that we gain strength and perseverance through our daily activity of prayer. As a church you have heard many times this saying, "Prayer is to the soul

what oxygen is to the body." I don't think prayer at times is our natural instinct. It hasn't been for me. In the fast paced life that we live, prayer is squeezed out of life.

Yet as life goes on, prayer becomes more and more important. I want to spend more time with Christ than ever before. In fact the Pew Forum has measured how we pray more as we age.

Statistics from the Pew Forum on Religion in Public Life seem to indicate that with age comes passion for daily prayer:

Gen Xers (born between 1965-80) who prayed daily in the late 1990s: 42 percent

Gen Xers who pray daily now: 54 percent

Boomers (born between 1946-64) who prayed daily in the early 1980s: 47 percent

Boomers who pray daily now: 62 percent

We pray knowing that God can do many things through His promises. The greatest and deepest promise is that we abide in Jesus Christ. Emma Gray knew that to the core of her being. She wanted our leaders to abide in the gifts that Christ could give to them.

Emma Daniel Gray died on June 8, 2009, at the age of 95. There was a big story about her in the *Washington Post* because for 24 years she was the woman who cleaned the office of the President of the United States. She served six presidents until she retired in 1979. Her official title? Charwoman.

What made the story even more interesting was that Mrs. Gray was a devout Christian. She would stand and pray over the President's chair each time she dusted it—her cleaning supplies in one hand, the other on the chair. She'd pray for blessings, wisdom, and safety.

While reflecting on the way she lived life, her pastor said, "She saw life through the eyes of promise is the way I'd put it. You can always look around and find reasons to be [unhappy]...but you couldn't be around her and not know what she believed." That is exactly what God's people do: see life through the eyes of promise—and pray accordingly. This year will hold many promises that will be

realized in our lives, and some on which we will have to wait. But we know that through our faith, which He even has given to us as a gift, we celebrate even when we can't see our prayers fully realized.

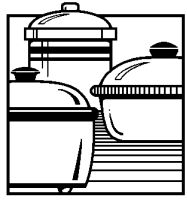

FROM KRYSTLE WILCOX, THE WORLD RACE:

December 2010

Hello Kennewick First Pres!

I can't tell you what an amazing journey the World Race has been thus far. THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU for all of your prayers and support! I can't tell you in words how much it means to me, and how many people have already been touched by the work that God is allowing to be done through my squad.

In Guatemala, my team Pneuma painted houses to brighten up a small, poverty-stricken neighborhood, visited a Mayan pastor blessing him with a ministry gift to send five of his children to school for a year, helped a family paint tiny yellow boxes for extra income, delivered water filters to Mayan families, and all while praying for countless people along the way.

In Nicaragua my team, paired with team Lovebound, worked at the orphanage of Cicrin on the island of Ometepe. There we ministered to the children first and foremost, through evenings of Bible studies, prayer and worship. In addition, we helped to fill the physical needs of our contact by working in the garden harvesting and planting, as well as building an additional house for the property.

To go into detail about the work of the "entire" 60+ folk on the S-Squad would be near impossible, but I'd encourage you to check out their blogs!!! Exciting stuff is happening "around the world" for the kingdom of God, and there are no sweeter rewards than to be a part of it! Next year, Adventures in Missions is expected to send out over 800 racers on the field, in addition to the 300+ people that are on the field right now.

As for this month, my team just found out not too long ago that we will be ministering to jungle tribe of Nogle Bogle in Panama. (One out of nine teams was chosen for this particularly difficult ministry, and after much prayer and consideration, leadership found team Pneuma to be ready for such a task.) At this moment, we don't have much information other than we will be hiking a couple of hours to get there, using our tents, and without electricity. I can't tell you all how exciting it is to be sent to one of the remaining unreached people groups: to speak the name to Jesus to people who may have never heard that name before!

Ways that you can keep my teammates and me in prayer:

- *For GOOD HEALTH - doctors may be hard to get to in the jungle.
- *For OPEN EYES to see God's work in the jungle.
- *For COMMUNICATION barriers to be broken.
- *For UNITY amongst my team.
- *For BOLDNESS- now, tomorrow, and throughout the race.

I love you all, and wish you all the best. LIFE is a gift, not a moment to be wasted!
