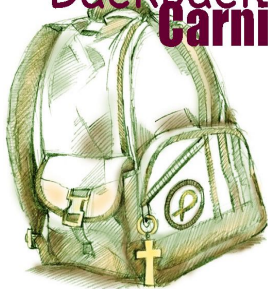

FROM THE PASTORS



I have been reflecting on how summer gives us time to live life at a different pace. It is a great time to enjoy God's creation and get outside. Opportunity is what God gives to us when the sun is shining, in a way we may not have at any other time of year. Our English word "opportunity" comes from Latin and means "toward the port." It suggests a ship taking advantage of the wind and the tide to arrive safely in the harbor.

A few years ago I went with our Barnabas Team to Rainbow Glacier Camp. I would see Jay, the camp director of over 20 years, walking along the meadow. Periodically, Jay would stop, look up at the mountains and become transfixed. Even after 20 years, he couldn't resist that break to drink in God's creation - a beauty break, a time to savor the lush surroundings. Beauty captures our attention and our hearts; it re-creates us.

Think about all the diversity of creation that is present during summer. The plants that have been dormant shine in all their glory; vegetables spring up ready to be eaten; summer fruits bless our tables and our palates. Not only is it about creation, it is about us affirming life in all its variety and complexity.

The church confesses that God is the maker of heaven and earth and all things within them. This conviction about our origins has great implications for the way we view the world around us. When we take a beauty break, we are affirming once again our faith in God the creator and redeemer who gives us the opportunity to take advantage of the summer months and the beauty of His creation.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, Over the years I have continued to stress the importance of knowing God's word and applying it to our lives.

Psalm 119:9-13 says this, "How can a young man [person] keep his [or her] way pure? By living according to your word. I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you. Praise be to you, O Lord; teach me your decrees. With my lips I recount all the laws that come from your mouth."



These verses stress the importance of not only knowing God's word but burying it so deep in our hearts that we are able to recall it. This requires intentionality and work on our part. However, the rewards of our efforts are tremendous. So once again I find myself urging you to memorize scripture, with a commitment to you that I am going to once again begin to apply myself to the task as well. Remember, no matter your age, with God's help you can do this. It is good for your brain health; it combats the aging of the brain and helps children develop brain muscles that modern media tends to re-wire.

Here are some tips that might help you.

Set goals or a goal. The point is not *how much* you memorize but *that* you memorize. Just try it; start.

Pick a translation that works for you to memorize, and stick to it.

Decide what to memorize. The Bible is a big book. If you need help deciding or starting, pray, ask for help, search around.

Once you are ready to start, remember to:

Take it one bite at a time. Verse by verse, or if a verse is long, comma to comma.

Use the beat. Some portions of Scripture have a rhythm. Go with it. Make up a ditty, a song, rap it, swing it, tap it, whatever might work for you.

Copy it. Type it. Use 3 x 5 cards, the back of unused business cards or find your own style. Doing this helps with your visual memory.

Find a study partner. Perhaps your small group together can take on the challenge, your kids, spouse or a coffee friend.

Other points are:

Pick a convenient time, a consistent time. Carry it with you. Keep it visible. Repeat, repeat, repeat. Review regularly. And most importantly, **DON'T GIVE UP!**

May God bless you in this endeavor. I really encourage you to try. And if you let me know how you are doing, I will tell you how I am coming along with it. Pastor Kriss

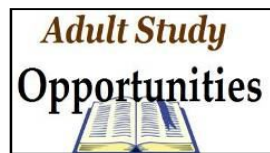

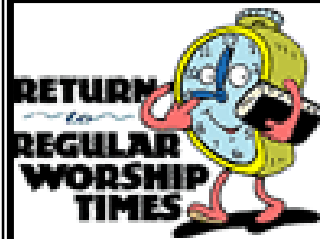

Grief Support Groups, Fall 2011... open to the public

Coping with the death of a loved one can be difficult. Some individuals seek the assistance of a Grief Support Specialist. Others prefer spending time with a small group of people working together through their grief. Whatever you choose, we are here to help...*you are not alone*. **Please refer to the web site above or call 783-7416 for further information, fees, or to register.**

Understanding Grief: This one-time session is open to adults experiencing grief due to the death of a loved one. It is an educational experience as well as a unique support group. The next class is on Thursday, August 11. Times are 12:00-2:00 p.m. and 6:30-8:30 p.m.

Hope for the Holidays: This class is available to help grieving people deal with the stress, loneliness and confusion of the holiday season. The next classes will be held in November and December 2011.

Coming to Terms with Loss: This group is open to adults experiencing grief due to the death of a loved one. This group is educational as well as supportive. The next group will meet on Tuesdays, August 30-November 15, 2011, 6:00-7:30 p.m.

Widowed Support Group: Widows, widowers and partners who have lost a loved one will discuss topics centered in role changes and transitions. This group will meet on Wednesdays, August 31-November 16. Times are 12:00-1:30 p.m. or 6:00-7:30 p.m.

Cork's Place for Grieving Children and Their Families: These sessions are specifically for children ages 3-18 years. Ongoing groups meet regularly. There is a support group for parents and/or guardians provided at the same time the children are in session.

Cancer Support Group: This group is open to adults dealing with the effects of cancer in their lives.

Grieving Parent's Support Group: This group is open to adults experiencing grief due to the death of a child of any age. It is educational as well as supportive. The group meets Thursdays, September 8-November 17. Time is 7:00-8:30 p.m.

Survivors of Suicide: SOS helps people adjust after a loved one dies by suicide. We recognize that each survivor has his or her own sorrows and support needs. Some people come to SOS soon after the suicide; others come years later. This group will meet August 29-November 14.

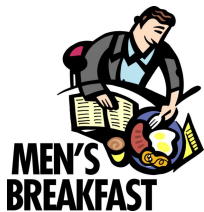
