## FROM THE PASTORS



Worship is our response to a continuing conversation that God has initiated. Every time we worship we are really declaring in our heart of hearts that God is worthy of our attentiveness, our time, our devotion, and our love. If the truth be known, our soul cannot function without worship. We cannot ignore it for long. Let me give you an example: think about how many times you rely upon the invention of the wheel in your life. By hopping in your car and driving out your driveway, you are indebted to someone over 4,000 years ago who invented that first wheel to help in his daily life. Every time we drive, it is in response to that incredible invention. When we worship at the beginning of the day, it is a response to what God has already been doing through the night. It is good to start the day with worship to help us through our day, just as we turn on the ignition to help us in our daily life.

Worship is one of our core values at Kennewick First Presbyterian because we know how deep the Father's love is for us when we are in worship individually and corporately. Through worship the Holy Spirit quickens the congregation to an awareness of our Lord's grace and His claim upon our lives. The Spirit moves us to respond by naming and calling upon God, by remembering and proclaiming God's acts of self-revelation in word and deed, and by committing our lives to God's reign in the world.

The Lenten Season will soon be here and we will have many opportunities during that time period to make our way to Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and then the magnificent day of Easter.

Lent begins on February 22. Ash Wednesday begins with a Taize service at 6:00 a.m. We conclude the day together by remembering our Lord's sacrifice. Like two bookends, we will begin and conclude the day with worship. The 6:00 a.m. service will be a simple communion service to begin the day. If you are not a morning person, do not worry. Join us that evening for the Ash Wednesday service at 7:00 p.m. Come and join us as we begin the Lenten Season.

### COUPLES

You get your oil changed every 3,000 miles . . . you get your teeth cleaned at least once a year . . . you even get regular physical exams . . . Your marriage deserves a checkup too! KFPC is offering an opportunity to be proactive in your marriage. Beginning on Sunday, February 12 through March 12, 2012, we will have the Couple Checkup Inventory available for you and your spouse to complete online. The cost is \$24.99 per couple.

Marriage Enrichment is about couples being proactive. It involves being learners and receiving feedback as you identify what your relationship needs to remain vibrant. Some couples wait until they've been struggling for several years before getting help. They are not proactive; they are reactive. In some cases, irreversible damage is done because couples neglect their relationship, ignore the warning signs, and push through the pain without addressing their relational needs.

The Couple Checkup relationship inventory represents an innovative and foundational tool for marriage enrichment. It can be used alone or in combination with enrichment books, seminars, or marriage retreats. If you are in need of further help, your pastoral staff along with Elder Kay Hadley will be available to assist you. KFPC leadership will receive a report on the overall inventory for participating couples in our congregation. Names of individuals or couples will not be reported.

Here's more of what you can expect:

**Discover** - By taking an online relationship inventory and generating your Couple Checkup Report will stir your curiosity. As you explore your results, you and your partner will discover your strengths and issues. You'll see where you agree and disagree as you gain insight into one another's perceptions of your marriage. You need to know where you're starting from so you can chart a course for where you want to go.

**Share** - A key to any great relationship is communication. But how do you bring up the difficult topics? How do you create a safe environment for open discussion? The topics covered in the Couple Checkup help generate productive conversations you wouldn't otherwise have—conversations that apply specifically to your relationship.

**Grow** - Each couple going through the Couple Checkup process has access to a free Discussion Guide. This workbook is filled with easy-to-use exercises designed to introduce new skills and facilitate discussions that will help you move from insight to action.

#### Discovering God's World: Preschool Science Camp

July 2-26, 2012

One of the many delights in working with preschoolers is hearing them repeat the things you have taught them in their own words. Recently we got to experience a wonderful example of that. For the "Letter li Week" the preschool learned all about islands. We learned the geological ways that God used to make all different kinds of islands: continental, barrier, coral, and volcanic. We learned about polar islands, tropical islands, and islands that are just like the places where we live. A three-year-old girl came into preschool the following week and proudly announced, "Teachers, I saw an island on the way to school today...and God made it"! Those are the moments that preschool teachers live for and the reason behind introducing Preschool Science Camp this summer. Providing "Exploring God's World: Science Camp for Preschoolers" is a natural extension of the way our church and Noah's Ark Preschool have valued faith and science together as an important part of our ministry and community.

The Camp will consist of morning and afternoon classes, both meeting Monday-Thursday during the first four weeks in July. We are going to study the following subjects: *Poof, Splash Thud: States of Matter*, *Rocking our World: Geology Explorations*, *Pop Pop Fizz Fizz: Chemical Reactions*, and *Dirt to Dinner: Plant Life Cycles*. Registrations for Science Camp will be open to First Pres and Noah's Ark families starting March 1, 2012, two weeks before registration is open to the public. If integrating science and faith is an important ministry to you, there are numerous ways in which you can help. We would like to extend an invitation to all current, retired and hobby scientists who would like to share their faith and passion as a "Guest Scientist." Even if you have never "taught" preschoolers before, be assured they don't bite and are actually very enthusiastic and involved scientific learners. They can ask hard questions though!

Also, as we are starting this from scratch we have only minimal science classroom supplies. If you have any old science equipment: microscopes, balance scales, beakers, cylinders, even old science kits taking up space, we would love to use them.

We would also truly appreciate money donations to purchase classroom sets of magnifying glasses, goggles, lab coats, etc., and science exploration tables that can be used by all children's ministries in the church.
